Pesticides registered and banned and incidences in Latin America

In this section of the PAN Latin America homepage you can find information about Latin American countries' legislation on pesticides, up to date information on pesticide registration and about bans in 17 countries. National outlines of chemicals management are also available. It is also possible to find the list of pesticides registered in each country enclosing classification of the World Health Organisation (WHO) as Ia (extremely hazardous) and Ib (highly hazardous). Data on and cases of pesticide poisonings and fatal poisonings are also registered here. Active ingredients and chemical groups accounting for incidences are identified provided this information was available in the cases stated.

National legislations in Latin America

In this section of the PAN Latin America homepage you can find information about 17 Latin American country's national legislation on pesticides, up to date registration and bans. National Outlines on Chemicals Management are also available. It is also possible to find the list of pesticides registered in each country enclosing the classes Ia (extremely hazardous) and Ib (highly hazardous) of the World Health Organisation. Pesticide poisonings and deaths are also enclosed. Active ingredients and chemical families accounting for those incidences are also identified provided this information was available in the cases here stated.

For instance in Central America 107 pesticides have been restricted because of their risks and negative impact on health and environment in this Latin American region. Research on these risks and effects was made available in a study conducted by the Panamerican Health Organization (PAHO) within the framework of the project PEST HEALTH (PLAGSALUD).
